



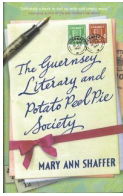

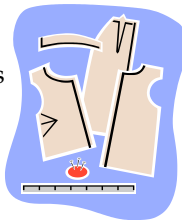
ADULT LEARN TO SEW
